  - Lasse Chr. Nielsen is an economist with more than 19 years professional experience. He is specialized in public finance economics, macro-economic planning and analysis and health and education economics.
  - He holds ample experience in macroeconomic and business cycle analysis, public finance strategic planning (MTSS and MTEF), PFM reform design and evaluation, assessments on cost-effectiveness/benefit in provision of public services with specialisation in health and education economics and related priority setting.
  - Mr Nielsen is well experienced in financial sustainability and economic issues of disease specific projects/programmes (mainly HIV/AIDS) in the health sector including feasibility analysis, costing and budgeting of National Strategic Plans, including Costing of Operational Plan related to the Bhutan National Strategic Plan on HIV/AIDS and calculation of related Financial Gap Analysis in 2009. During this mission he was co-facilitating a work-shop with the Bhutan MoH with participants from other government ministries and institutions.
  - Currently he is permanent sustainability advisor (TSU member) on 7-year HIV/AIDS harm reduction program in Central Asia (CARHAP), DFID 2005-2010, recently extended by 2 years: 2011-2012.
  - His expertise area also covers social assessments of health reforms including issues of social protection, poverty alleviation, equity and gender issues, service provision to ethnic minorities, indigenous populations and poor/disadvantaged population groups. During his 5 year work experience in Greenland Mr Nielsen has developed a balanced cross cultural sensitivity by working with Inuit (indigenous population of Greenland) in accordance with his appointments in central government of Greenland (1996-2001).
  - He is also experienced in outcome analysis, socio-economic assessments, sustainable financing analysis, national strategic planning and program evaluations, e.g. an external review of the DFID co-financed HAPAC program in China.
  - Besides his long time experience from Greenland on health reform Mr. Nielsen also holds experience in health system assessments with main focus on finance and cost related issues in economies with smaller populations, mainly Greenland and UK Overseas Territories (UKOT's), including St. Helena, Ascension and Montserrat (Caribbean).
  - In 2008 and 2011 Mr. Nielsen has mainly been working on consultancies related to Public Finance Management (PFM) evaluations, Medium-Term Sector Strategy (MTSS) and Medium-Term Expenditure Framework (MTEF) on both Federal and State level in Nigeria (2008) and in Greenland (2010/2011/2012). The Nigerian MTSS and MTEF had the overall aim to achieve macroeconomic stability and for directing public spending to the nation's strategic priorities (MDGs) for particularly the health and education sector. During his most recent health related assignment in Nigeria he was facilitating a MTEF/MTSS process for the Ministry of Health in the Federal Government, Abuja,

including facilitation of workshops for government officers on priority issues related to short and longer term strategic health planning including HIV/AIDS. Currently, Lasse Nielsen is for the third time team leader on conducting a comprehensive reporting for the Greenland Government to the EU Commission on a co-financed vocational training programme (PFM, MTEF, AWP and AIR). This reporting has included in-depth macro-economic and public finance analysis as well as facilitation of work-shops discussing topics related to the macro-economic development in Greenland.
