The Gender Pay Gap

presented by

Rachel Armstrong, KPMG Australia

Rachel will present on the economics of the gender pay gap. She will provide an overview of a report that was prepared by KPMG Australia and others. The report models factors contributing to the gender pay gap and analyses the potential impacts of strategies targeted at drivers of the gender pay gap. Rachel will compare the pay gap in Australia to various other jurisdictions. Rachel will build on the above to outline evidence showing the economic impact of pay gaps and the impact that it has on GDP, detailing how increasing women's participation in the workforce and closing the pay gap between women and men will have a positive impact on economic growth.

Rachel is an economist who currently works in the Policy, Programmes and Evaluation consulting team within KPMG Australia. She has a background in development economics and has worked for various different organisations and aid agencies across the Pacific and in St Helena.
